
















Name: Brickman

First appearance: After Image No.3 (1979) Last appearance: Brickman Returns (2009)

Name: Norris Wimple

First appearance: Unnatural Disasters (STC #102)

Last appearance: Fan Friction (STC #124)

Profile: Hey, that's me! Mobius' premier badnik spotter and number two STC trivia nerd (Ryan Baggit wasn't available at the time of writing—Megadroid). I like the works of Fabian Vane, and long walks in the countryside (best place to find badnik remains). Name: Commander Brutus

First appearance: Project Brutus (STC #63)

Last appearance: Showdown (STC #130)

Profile: Just like Shortfuse, Commander Brutus has armour made from Megatal, a super-hard alloy that even Sonic is unable to damage! Unlike Shortfuse, Brutus's mind is made from a copy of Robotnik's himself—ew! It took the chaotic power of Super Sonic to issue Brutus' first defeat, and he was finally destroyed by Robotnik himself when he got too big for his boots—and that's why you don't name a creation after an infamous Roman traitor!

Name: Combat Colin

First appearance: Action Force #5 (1988) Last appearance: Aces Weekly #50 (2021)

Profile: Together with his mate Semi-Automatic Steve, Combat Colin is a military enthusiast whose heart is in the right place even if his brain isn't. One time he even paired up with Brickman in, um, Portmeirion, after his deep-pocketed trousers were stolen by The Brain!

Name: Metamorphia

First appearance: Metamorphia (STC #30) Last appearance: Showdown (STC #130)

Profile: A shapeshifting lifeform created by Grimer for Doctor Robotnik, Metamophia nearly defeated Sonic several times after disguising herself as Tails, long lost relatives, and children in peril. He always saw past her though, especially when she took the form of a gas! Grimer perhaps poured a little too much of his adoration for his master into Metamorphia, who grew to adore him, only to be rejected and have her powers removed, but she went on to live her life as a reformed creature.

Name: Vermin the Cybernik

First appearance: Secret Weapon (STC #90)
Last appearance: Breakout (STC #121)

Profile: Shortfuse the Cybernik's arch nemesis! Unlike Shorty, who resisted the Cybernik armour's programming, Vermin volunteered to be placed permanently into the suit, and took commands willingly from Robotnik thereafter! Despite being threatened by Vermin's ability to inject a virus into his machinery, Shortfuse was eventually able to destroy Vermin's armour, but at the personal cost to himself of locking himself back inside the armour he'd just been freed from.

Name: Tekno the Canary

First appearance: Cybernik Strikes Back (STC #63)

Last appearance: Game Over (STC #174)

Profile: What kind of person would steal weapons from Robotnik while working for him, only to be exposed as a traitor to him and sent to be encased in a badnik as punishment? Oh, and who also has their own secret lair, and is friends with a short-tempered Cybernik? That's Tekno, and no wonder she got on so well with Amy while they were off adventuring in time and space through the Eternity Ring. Some say she might have settled down since meeting Amy, but she does still wear those explosive earrings...

Name: Amy Rose

First appearance: Girl Trouble (STC #21)

Last appearance: Point of No Return (STC #184)

Profile: Amy rose to prominence during Sonic's six-month absence that led to Robotnik taking over the planet, and was originally brown-quilled like Sonic until Robotnik tried to reproduce the accident that has turned Sonic blue. Amy strongarmed herself onto the Freedom Fighters' team, and when Robotnik was finally deposed, went off travelling with her gal pal Tekno—until the dictator returned to Mobius, when she rejoined the team.




